
















Welcome to our first newsletter for this school year. Halloween has crept up on us!

- Not admit girls to classes which are not yet coeducational.

Everyone loved doing extra Maths for the week!!! Brainteasers proved to be a highlight also! Maths Week was a fun and enjoyable week.




































### Writers of the Month








### **Building Bridges**

To celebrate Maths Week some students produced amazing symmetry, patterns, tessellation and 3D maths problems.








We started the term with some funny team-building games, and a good chat about setting up and organising our classroom and routines for the coming year.

We also did a piece for Dia de los Muertos which were all done to a great standard. We also drew spooooooky monsters.








We did club crests, and we also drew our names with shadows behind it.

### Maths Week 2022






