## Did You Know - Room 7


In Germany the first Christmas trees were decorated with edible things such as gingerbread and gold covered apples.

In 1885 a hospital in Chigago burned down because of candles on a Christmas tree. Because of the danger of fire, Ralph Morris invented the first electric Christmas lights in 1895.

Advent helps us to count down the days to Christmas. Advent calendars trace their origin to 19<sup>th</sup> Century Germany. Some families used a wooden structure with twenty four candles to mark the passing of each day.

Plum puddings were first made in medieval England. It was made with thirteen ingredients to represent Jesus and the twelve apostles. In 1714 King George was known as the Pudding King.
