Mr. Leahy's 3rd Class here. We're delighted to share with you some examples of the great work we've been doing and fun we have been having so far this




year.








For Easter Art we created 3D Easter eggs using perspective and shading. We think they turned out really well. We hope you like them:











In Geography we delved into Weather. We learned about Weather Lore and some of the old saying people used to predict weather. Some of our favourites include 'When the swallows fly high, the weather will be dry' and 'If it rains before 7, it'll be dry by 11'.


We then took a closer look at extreme weather and focused on Tornadoes. We learned about how they form, how Tornado Alley sees more tornadoes than anywhere else in the world and how global warming is leading to more tornadoes. We watched clips of Tornadoes, listened to interviews by Tornado chasers and survivors.

We created Mind maps to document our learning and even used charcoal to draw them.





In History, the Romans was our topic of choice. As well as looking at the origins of Rome and daily life we focused on the life of a Roman soldier, their training and equipment.







In PE, we were lucky to have 6 weeks of Swimming lessons in the Watershed. We got the bus up every Thursday morning. It was so much fun, and our swimming greatly improved. When that finished, we moved on to learning how to play Rounders in the field and worked on our Fundamental Movement Skill of 'Striking with the Hand'.





In Oral Language we have started a weekly Class Debate on a Friday evening. We learned all about the rules by which a debate is carried out first and the order of events. Our motions so far have been:

- Is digital technology making children's lives better?
- Books are better than television.

It has really helped us with skills like listening, teamwork, public speaking and expressing ourselves clearly. In English we have been hard at work in many areas. We have nearly finished Stanley by Peter Gunning: our second novel of the year. Our writing genre has been procedural writing which is ongoing. So far, we have written about 'How to make our favourite sandwich' and 'How to make a cup of tea'. We are looking forward to typing one up using our chromebooks. We have really enjoyed a new website called GetEpic which Mr. Leahy introduced us to. We are able to log in and read lots more free books online.

We also enjoyed a Nature walk where we brought the iPads and took photos of our local environment and the beautiful things it has to offer.



We have been working really hard on improving our cursive handwriting and so when Mr. Leahy told us we would be doing a Science Project entitled 'Communications of the Future' we felt this was a great opportunity to showcase our handwriting to the rest of the school. The projects centred around advances in technology that will change the way we communicate in the future. In PE, apart from preparing for the sports day we tried bowling in the yard and visited the Astroturf for some soccer. It's great having the Astroturf so close.




