

C.B.S. Chess Club

As a chess coach who was obliged to teach chess online for two years, owing to the pandemic, it was a real pleasure to get back



teaching chess in person last January in C.B.S.

My sincere thanks to Principal Niall Bergin for championing the merits of chess and for giving me the opportunity to come in and give a weekly class. My thanks also to Thomas Sinnott, who ran a tight ship as far as all the admin and organizing was concerned, thereby enabling the chess club to run like a well-oiled machine.

Owing to the wide variety of experience and differing levels of knowledge, during the first term, I divided the class into two groups: Complete Beginners (The Challengers) and Experienced Beginners. This was to give newcomers to the game a chance to find their feet playing players their own level before taking on more experienced players.

The Experienced **Beginners** Spring Term competition was jointly won by Diarmuid Kealy and Conor Bowe, while the Challengers Competition for new players was won by George Ng, who shaded first place by half a point from Daniel Tuohy in clear second and George's younger brother Ben who finished clear-third. The standard of both competitions was extremely high, and such was the level of improvement across the board—every pun intended—can't resist − sorry ²⁰ − I was able to run a single competition in the Summer Term.

A number of new recruits to the club in the Summer Term presented an additional challenge to the victors from the Spring term. There were several examples of talent and creativity displayed in the chess club during the chess competition which was held over 5 weeks. See **link** for more details.

One of the real benefits of being in a chess club is the opportunity to analyse your games with a coach or other players in your class. In this way, it is possible to discover all sorts of hidden defensive resources and attacking possibilities that may have been overlooked in the course of battle.

Even in an endgame, simple traps and tactics can decide a game!

I am fairly confident that had I been playing white against an IM or GM, I would also have offered a draw as white or accepted a draw as black. Both Jakub and Conor showed exceptional judgment in assessing the position and both players made a strong and wise practical choice. This happens to be one of the key areas where chess thinking can cross over into and assist in real-life decision making.

Thanks to Diarmuid's win over Conor in round 4, Conor had to be content with a highly creditable joint first-place once again, this time with Ryan Matthew. Daniel Tuohy and Cian Delaney finished joint 3rd-4th. Connor Ryan was the most improved player in the Summer Term.

Many thanks to all the parents who enrolled their kids for the Chess Club this year. I am very much looking forward to returning to C.B.S. in September.

In the meantime, I would just like to let you know I am running a chess camp for kids at Kilkenny Rugby Club from the 17th-19th July. See https://chessbud.ie/killarney-kids-camp/

I am also running an Online Summer Training Programme throughout the summer till the 31st of August for those kids can't make the camp – for those rainy days when football and hurling may not be an option!








Lego Construction Club

Club members designed their own board games.




Another design feature included Beyblades. They had much to consider for this assignment. After all, to become the winner of our tournament, their Beyblade must withstand all opponents.













































Mrs. Bolger & Ms. Howell's 4th Class

We took part in a fun volleyball tournament in the Watershed, involving a number of schools in the city, and run by Transition Year pupils from the Presentation Secondary School.












Snack and Browse






















Arts and Crafts Club


























