- The Board nominates two community representatives, and all eight nominees are appointed by the Patron Bishop.


Writers of the Month

























Maths Week






















School Gaelic Football




Lunchtime Gaelic Football Leagues took place throughout the months of September and October under the guidance of Mr. Fitzpatrick.










We also were able to visit the Watergate Theatre for Barnstorm Theatre's production of "Noah Barleywater Runs Away" The boys really enjoyed the experience.

They have been enjoying their Gaelic Football coaching on Fridays with Stephen and have learned lots of new skills. They look forward to starting Tag Rugby this week.





Ms. Curran's 6th Class


Well done to all the boys in Room 8 on a very busy and productive first term in 6th Class.

Our class scientists impressed with their knowledge of science in our recent experiments investigating density and solubility.













The Author's Visit




Art










Ukulele Classes
