





The pupils then called to each class in the school to share all the waste tips they had learned. We also got brand new bins for our classrooms and they look pretty neat.

## **Lego Construction Club**








## Mrs. Larkin's Junior Infants Class






We had fantastic fun-filled Samba Drumming sessions with Tom from Music Generation each



In recent weeks we have gotten to use the fantastic facilities over at Freebooters FC. We have really enjoyed our PE lessons over there.






#### **Art Lessons**


