Music Evaluation Report

As you are aware the school recently had a Music Evaluation conducted by the Department of Education Inspectorate. We are delighted to inform you that we received an extremely positive report, and the Inspectorate spoke so highly of our school community.

Here are some of the findings and recommendations. The full report will be available in September.

Findings

• The overall quality of pupils' learning in Music was very good with pupils demonstrating commendable knowledge and understanding of musical concepts.

- Learning experiences in Music were very good, particularly in song singing and performing, which were deeply embedded in the school culture.
- Pupils' musical achievements were celebrated and learning environments were very positive and inclusive.
- Teaching in Music was of a very good quality, with elements of excellent practice also observed.
- Whole-school planning, including school self-evaluation (SSE), was very effective.

Recommendations

 All pupils should be supported to read musical notation and be provided with opportunities to read and compose simple melodies.






Lego Construction Club












Mrs. Moloney's 2nd Class
