I take this opportunity to wish all in our school community a Happy and Peaceful Christmas and may 2026 be a happy and healthy year for all.








Christmas Jumper Day


There was a huge excitement throughout the school on Thursday, December 11th when we had our Christmas Jumper Day for charity.

In November we learned all about the theme of food. We even did some printing using vegetables and paint.














We also celebrated Science Week where we made our own musical shakers with different foods inside. We then tested them out to see which ones were the loudest and which were the quietest.


Odd Socks Day was so enjoyable - we loved looking at all the crazy socks around the school that day too.




We also took a trip to St. Canice's Cathedral to see the Christmas Tree Festival. It was great fun walking around and picking out our favourite ones.


Music Generation


Sandra, our music teacher, has done a great job with first class. They have been learning how to use their body to make different sounds and have been using different instruments to help them sing along to songs in class.

We had a great first term in Room 12. The boys have put in a huge effort both in the classroom and at home.


The boys are really enjoying all the hands-on activities in STEM. We also had some great designs of simple machines which they worked on independently and in groups.


















We have been covering narrative genres in English Writing and the boys have produced top-class work on our Chromebooks. Our writing wall is looking very impressive.

We learned so much from Paddy and it was great to hear about events that had happened in our city.







7 Wonders of the Modern World Projects
